


If moisture forms inside this player, it may not operate properly. In this case, turn off the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.




S-video output connectors

The S(separate) video output connector separates the color(C) an dluminance(Y) signals before transmitting them to the TV set in order to achieve a sharper picture.


Use the S-video cable (not included)when connecting the player to aTV set equipped with an S-Video input connector for the best picture clarity possible.

The YCbCr connector outputs the color signals (luminance, red, blue color difference primary) in order to achieve high fidelity in reproducing colors.






POSITION ALL 5 SPEAKER APPROXIMATELY AT THE SAME DISTANCE FROM YOUR LISTENING POSITION. POSITION THE SUBWOOFER AS BELOW.

Your system is supplied with 5 compact size satellite speakers. The satellite speakers and the center speaker reproduce only the mid range and higher frequencies. All of the low frequency (bass) sounds are produced by the theater. Proper positioning and placement of the speakers important in order to provide the best surround sound experience. We understand that due to the size and shape of your listening room, and the location of your furniture, you may not be able to set up the speakers exactly as per these diagrams. However these simple guidelines will help you maximize your home theatre experience.

- Note the speaker levels are preset at the factory and most people will not need to fine tune the sound of each speaker. We suggest you skip this part at first. Later on you can adjust the sound level of each individual speaker.
- Although all 5 satellites are of the same size, the speakers inside
 the cabinets are color-coded, as are the speakers wires and the
 speaker terminals on the back of the main unit, refer to the
 connection diagram on page 11.Be sure you are using the correct
 satellite speaker in each location, front, rear and center. Please
 follow the colors for best results.
- For best surround sound effects, all 5 of the satellite speakers should be roughly at the same distance from your usual listening position.

Position the speakers like this for optimal listening experience



- All 5 satellite speakers should be placed approximately the same distance from your listening position.
- The center speaker should be placed directly above (or below) the TV set. Left and right front speakers should be approximately at the same height as the center speaker.
- The rear speakers should be either in line with , or behind your listening position, approximately at ear level, or slightly above.
- The subwoofer should be on the floor near the TV, or in any corner, with the front hole facing your listening position.
- All speakers must be visible, do not hide them behind curtains, furniture, etc. As this will affect the sound.

Optional audio connections

Notes when connecting the optical digital audio cable (optional)

- Remove the dust protection cap from the optical digital audio output and connect the cable firmly so that the configurations of both the cable and the connector match.
- Keep the dust protection cap and to protect against dust, always reattach the cap when not using the connector.



For your reference:

Insert the batteries while observing the correct (+) and (-) polarities as illustrated at right.

Service life of batteries

- The batteries normally last for about one year although this depends on how often, and for what operations, the remote control unit is used.
- If the remote control unit fails to work even when it is operated near the player, replace the batteries.
- Use 2 size AAA batteries.

Note:


- Do not use rechargeable (Ni-Cd) batteries
- Do not attempt to recharge, short-circuit, disassemble, heat or throw the batteries into the fire.
- Do not drop, step on or otherwise impact the remote control unit. This may damage the parts or lead to malfunction.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- If the remote control unit is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries. Otherwise, electrolyte may leak which may lead not only to malfunctioning but also to burns if contact is made with the electrolyte.
- Wipe away any electrolyte leaking inside the remote control unit, and install new batteries.
- If any electrolyte should come into contact with parts of your body, wash it off thoroughly with water.

Remote control operation range

- Point the remote control unit from no more than about 3-4 m from the remote control sensor and within about 60° of the front of the player.
- The operating distance may vary according to the brightness of the room.

Note:

- Do not point bright lights at the remote control sensor.
- Do not place objects between the remote control unit and the remote control sensor.
- Do not use this remote control unit while simultaneously operating the remote control unit of any other equipment.

NOTE: When no soundtrack languages are recorded, press this button will not work.

Definition of terms

Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

Chapter number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which is numbered, and specific parts of video presentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

DVD

This refers to a high-density optical disc on which high-quality pictures and sound have been obtained by means of digital signals.incorporation a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology,DVD enables esthetically pleasing full-motion video to be recorded over long periods of time (for instance,a whole movie can be recorded).

DVD has a structure consistion of two 0.6mm thin discs which are adhered to each other since the thinner the disc, the higher the density at which the information can be recorded, a DVD disc has a greater capacity than a single 1.2mm thick disc . since the two thin discs are adhered to each other, there is the potential to achieve double-sided play sometime in the future for even longer duration play.

Playback control(PBC)

This is recorded on a Video CD (version 2.0). The scenes or information to be viewed (or listened to) can be selected interactively with the TV monitor by looking at the menu shown on the TV monitor.

Subtitles

This is the appearance of the dialogue at the botton of the screen which are prerecorded on some DVD discs.

Time number

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly.(It may not work with some discs.)

Title number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title1, title2, etc.

Track number

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on Video Cds and Cds. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

Video CD

This contains recordings of pictures and sound whose quality is on a par with that of videotape. This player also supports Video Cds with playback control (version 2.0).
